FACULTY INSTRUCTIONAL IMPROVEMENT CHANGES**

WHEREAS, the bureaucracy erected for accountability and the paperwork of Instructional Improvement reflect a lack of trust in the professional integrity of the faculty; and

WHEREAS, our 90-hour instructional improvement requirement is among the highest in the state; and

WHEREAS, the 17-1/2 week multiplier is no longer necessary to capture all enrollment growth, since we are currently 20% over cap; and

WHEREAS, reducing the instructional improvement obligation and changing to a 17-week multiplier would have no detrimental effect on our funding level due to our enrollment growth; and

WHEREAS, counting Saturdays as part of the 175-day year, as is currently being done, would allow us to meet this requirement with a 16-week semester;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees reduce the 90-hour instructional improvement requirement to approximately 36 hours per academic year (effective Fall 2003).
