



## Getting Started at City College

*Services to enroll and begin courses at City.*

**Admissions:** Rm A-112, (619) 388-3475. Apply to City College in person or online at [studentweb.sdccd.edu](http://studentweb.sdccd.edu)

**Records:** Rm A-109, (619) 388-3474. Submit official transcripts from all colleges and universities you have previously attended.

**Evaluations:** Rm A-110, (619) 388-3466. Request evaluation of your previous college/university coursework to satisfy City College requirements.

**Financial Aid:** Rm A-113, (619) 388-3501. Federal and State grants, loans, work-study and fee waivers are available to assist eligible students with their educational and living expenses. Apply online at [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov)

**DSPS (Disability Support Programs and Services):** Rm A-115, (619) 388-3513. Support is available for students with a verifiable disability to help them achieve their academic and vocational goals. Services include specialized classes, priority enrollment, counseling and academic accommodations.

**Veterans:** Rm A-109, (619) 388-3504. Military service-connected benefits are available for eligible veterans and dependents.

**Math & English Assessment:** Schedule in Rm A-110, (619) 388-3540. Take Math and English assessment tests to determine the classes to take first at City.

**New Student Orientation:** Schedule in Rm A-110, (619) 388-3540. Learn about City College programs and receive advising for first-semester courses.

**Student Success Pathways:** Learning Community Programs with linked classes and support for student success, including counseling and/or tutoring.

- **City Links:** Rm T-109-V, (619) 388-3204. Learning Communities from Basics through Transfer.

- **FYE (First Year Experience):** Rm A-111, (619) 388-3951. For First Year students - provides comprehensive counseling & activities for university transfer.

- **Honors:** Rm A-1-N, (619) 388-3512. Emphasis on enhanced academic experience. Offers scholarships and transfer agreements to major universities.

- **Puente:** Rm A-110, (619) 388-3668. Emphasis on Chicano/Latina literature and culture. Puente counseling and mentoring prepare students for transfer.

- **Umoja:** Rm A-110, (619) 388-3796. Emphasis on African-American culture and experience. Helps students to succeed in Math and English classes.

**Registration:** Register and pay for courses, parking permits and other fees using Reg-e at [studentweb.sdccd.edu](http://studentweb.sdccd.edu). See the City College schedule for more info.

**A.S. (Associated Students) Cashier:** Rm D-106, (619) 388-3479. Pick-up monthly bus/trolley passes, A.S. membership and Financial Aid/EOPS checks.

**Accounting:** Rm A-114, (619) 388-3458. Pay for registration fees, A.S. membership, parking permits, transcripts, replacement ID cards, health services, child care, library and other miscellaneous fines.

**Campus Police:** Rm T-211, (619) 388-3461. Parking info & permits, lost & found, incident reports, escorts, bicycle licensing, battery jump and lockout service.

**Bookstore:** Rm A-12, (619) 388-3548. Purchase your textbooks and academic supplies. Also shop for school supplies, software, City College gift items and clothing, other gifts and snacks. To order textbooks online, visit [www.bookstore.sdccd.edu/city](http://www.bookstore.sdccd.edu/city)

## Plan Your Career, Major or Educational Goal

*The courses you take at City College will depend on your career and educational goals.*

**Transfer/Career Center:** Rm A-111, (619) 388-3722. Explore careers, majors and university transfer. Learn about guaranteed university admission.

**Counseling Center:** Rm A-110, (619) 388-3540. Appointments available for academic and career counseling. See a counselor for help in choosing a career and major. Also get counseling help to develop your education plan to meet your educational goals.

## Help with Schoolwork

*Tutoring and other services to enhance your success in the classroom.*

**Tutorial/Learning Center:** Rm R-212, (619) 388-3685. **FREE** individual, group, and online tutoring, academic skills workshops, supplemental instruction, computer lab, Math Cram Jam for Math 35, 95 and 96, and study group sessions in most subject areas.

**English Center:** Rm C-226, (619) 388-3633. **FREE** peer and online tutoring in reading, writing, ESL, and critical thinking classes. Workshops offered in writing, research and basic skills. Includes access to the English Center Computer Lab for Internet access, word processing and more.

**Math Center:** Rm T-208, (619) 388-3580. Walk-in math tutoring and open-entry/open-exit self-paced courses in Math 35, 95 and 96.

**Library:** "R" Bldg., (619) 388-3421. Books, periodicals, full-text electronic databases, Internet access and more available for **FREE** use. Courses are also offered in research skills and the effective use of library resources.

**Independent Learning Center:** R-105 - R-107, (619) 388-3535. Word processing, Internet access, independent learning materials, foreign language lab classes (courses numbered 296) and resources for improving academic skills or supporting in-class activities. **FREE** to all registered students.

**Multimedia Center:** Rm R-100, (619) 388-3418. Equipment and technical assistance available for student presentations.

## Financial, Medical and Personal Support

*Financial aid and other support services to help facilitate your education.*

**Financial Aid:** Rm A-113, (619) 388-3501. Federal and State grants, loans, work-study and fee waivers are available to assist eligible students with their educational and living expenses. Apply online at [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov)

**Counseling Center:** Rm A-110, (619) 388-3540. See a counselor to discuss personal concerns that might affect your academic success. Counseling appointments are done in a safe and confidential environment. Counselors can assist you to better understand problems, explore solutions and make personal choices.

**DSPS (Disability Support Programs and Services):** Rm A-115, (619) 388-3513. Support is available for students with a verifiable disability to help them achieve their academic and vocational goals. Services include specialized classes, priority enrollment, counseling and academic accommodations.

**Student Health Services:** Rm A-116, (619) 388-3450. **FREE** or low cost health services provided by registered nurses, nurse practitioners and a physician. Includes assessments, physicals, medications, emergency care, immunizations, health counseling, referrals, family planning and more.

**Mental Health Services:** Rm A-221, (619) 388-3539. **FREE** confidential psychotherapy services provided by licensed clinician and staff. Includes individual and group therapy, referrals to community resources, assistance with school related psychological difficulties, crisis intervention and relationship counseling.

**Scholarships:** Rm D-106, (619) 388-3498. **FREE** money available to qualifying City College students. Deadline for campus scholarships: Early December

**Child Development Center:** 16th and B Streets, (619) 388-3205. Educational program is available for children six weeks to five years old. Enrollment limited to children of parents attending day classes at City College. Evening services available for families that meet Head Start criteria.

**Student Affairs:** Rm D-106, (619) 388-3498. Your connection to the campus. Student Affairs is the campus contact for student life, student leadership development, community service, student grievances and student discipline. Provides fee deferment, book loans and student referrals to support services.

## Additional Specialized Services

*Enrichment programs and services specifically designed for students with particular interests, needs, or characteristics.*

**TRIO/ASPIRE:** Rm A-10, (619) 388-3407. Provides a variety of services to assist students to successfully transfer to universities. The program targets students who are low-income, first-generation or registered with the disabled students program.

**MESA (Math, Engineering, and Science Achievement):** Rm T-311E, (619) 388-3156. Supports economically disadvantaged students in math, engineering and science majors to successfully transfer to universities. Includes counseling, tutoring, internships, scholarships and an on-campus center.

**EOPS (Extended Opportunity Programs and Services):** Rm A-113, (619) 388-3209. Provides financial assistance, priority enrollment, specialized counseling, Summer Readiness Program and more to full-time qualifying students who meet eligibility criteria.

**New Horizons:** Rm A-10-C, (619) 388-3424. Provides textbook loans, transportation assistance, student academic planner, study skills booklet and referrals to programs/services to eligible vocational and/or nontraditional students.

**CalWORKs:** Rm A-10-A, (619) 388-3797. For students who receive welfare services/adult cash aid - provides academic counseling, work-study, referrals to other campus services and verification of book/ childcare/ transportation needs for welfare-to-work activities.

**Price Scholars:** Rm A-113-A, (619) 388-3244. Provides financial assistance, community service opportunities, counseling, mentoring & social activities.

**Student Government & Clubs:** Rm D-106, (619) 388-3358. The Associated Students sponsors many student programs and serves as the student voice in the governance of the college. There are also over 20 active student organizations on campus reflecting a diversity of interests.

**International Education:** Rm A-1-Q, (619) 388-3652. Learn a foreign language by studying in another country for a semester or short term. Classes satisfy degree requirements and are taught by U.S. professors. Immigration information is also available for international students.


## Get Ready to Leave City
