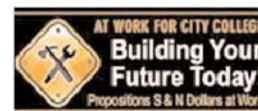

Accreditation Update

Part of the accreditation process requires that the Board of Trustees be informed and involved in the self-study. On March 12, Lynn Neault, Vice Chancellor of Student Services, gave a presentation to the Board. She presented them with a nutshell overview of the process, and with the work of the District-wide Accreditation Steering Committee which is overseeing the planning and coordinating activities to support a consistent process at all four institutions--City, Mesa, and Miramar Colleges, and Continuing Education.

There will be a special session at the end of the April 16 Board of Trustees meeting to dialog with the campus co-chairs of the Standard IV Committees. This standard addresses "Leadership and Governance," and looks at the policies and practices of the Board as well as the work of shared governance bodies, the college presidents and the chancellor. If you are interested in knowing more about Standard IV, or about the questions that the Standard IV Committee is compiling to ask the trustees, the co-chairs for City are Randy Barnes (x3488) and John Markley (x3795). You can also contact them through district e-mail.

At City College, our self-study process is in full swing. The standard co-chairs, with the members of their respective committees, are now in the process of writing the self-evaluation and formulating agenda items--the areas that we identify we want to improve. This work will be further refined when we have the results of student and employee opinion surveys as well as the point of service surveys that have been taking place this semester. If you are interested in dialoging with committee members about the agenda items, please remember that you can contact the standard co-chairs.

AARP Women's Scholarship Program Elder Economic Security Initiative

The AARP Foundation Women's Scholarship Program third round will be open from February 3 to March 31, 2009. For more information and to download the applications visit the website <http://www.aarpfoundationwlc.org>. The scholarship is open to low-income women 40+.

Priority is given to women who are in one of three categories:

- 1) women raising the children of another family member,
- 2) those in dead end jobs and
- 3) those who have been out of the paid workforce for an extended period.

The scholarships, which range from \$500 to \$5,000, are to be used for tuition and books and are paid directly to the educational institution. Nearly 300 hundred women were helped through the program in the first round and about 250 women received scholarships in round two. The program is funded by AARP with generous support from the AARP Foundation Women's Leadership Circle. (Ruffo)

Fitness Tip: The Food Guide Pyramid Guidelines

The traditional strategy of eating foods from four equally important food groups; (1) Milk, (2) Meat, (3) Fruits and (4) Vegetables and Grains was widely used. However, in 1992 after research had clearly demonstrated that the four food groups were not nutritionally equal, the federal government developed the new food guide pyramid.

The pyramid shows that plant foods such as grains, vegetables and fruits need to be the foundation of our diet. Smaller quantities of daily, high protein foods, fats, oils and sweets should be eaten.

The food guide pyramid now has more specific vegetables and fruits and recommended more daily servings of each. According to the pyramid, a diet that contains 1,600 calories per day should contain at least three servings of vegetables and two servings of fruit. A diet of 2,800 calories per day should have at least five servings of vegetables and four servings of fruit.



The food guide pyramid de-emphasizes animal foods because the body does not require a large serving to get the nutrients found in these foods and because they tend to be high in fat and saturated fat. (Greer)
