*Transfer Articulation Agreement
Between
Howard University and
San Diego Community College District*

I. Introduction

San Diego Community College District (SDCCD), a multi-campus community college in San Diego, California and Howard University, a doctoral research-extensive university in Washington, DC, agree to establish a formal articulation agreement between the institutions. San Diego Community College District consists of three colleges, namely, San Diego City, Mesa and Miramar.

II. Purpose

This agreement will facilitate the admission and transferability of academic credits of qualified students from San Diego City, Mesa and Miramar, regionally accredited community colleges into a four-year Bachelors degree program at Howard University.

III. Transfer General Principles


1. A student who plans to transfer from the San Diego City, Mesa or Miramar College to Howard University may transfer a maximum of 60 semester credit hours as approved by selected schools and colleges of Howard University, after satisfying all other applicable admission criteria.
2. Students who have completed the Associate in Arts or the Associate in Science degree may transfer to the appropriate Howard University degree program with junior standing. Howard University may allow for course substitution(s) for the course(s) in question in keeping with the policies and procedures of Howard University.
3. Students need to have a minimum of a 2.5 grade point average (GPA) in transfer level work or its equivalent for the stipulated minimum number of credit hours to be admitted into Howard University degree programs, unless otherwise stipulated in the articulation agreements of the selected schools or colleges. Howard University will accept only courses in which a student has earned a grade of "C" or higher.
4. Credit may be given for academic credits earned through internships, independent studies, directed studies, college or university without walls, continuing education or work study programs. Consideration for academic credit under these formats will require written descriptions and evaluations of such experiences, together with other relevant documentation and approval by the faculty of the host school or college at Howard University.
5. San Diego City, Mesa and Miramar College students transferring to Howard University will be given every consideration for financial aid and will be eligible to compete for academic scholarships upon admission to Howard University, subject to applicable scholarship criteria and deadlines.




6. San Diego Community College District and Howard University agree to work together to facilitate the transfer of students from San Diego City, Mesa and Miramar Colleges to Howard University and to work cooperatively to insure the high quality of their respective academic programs.
7. The minimum number of transfer credits from San Diego City, Mesa or Miramar College must be a minimum of 15 semester (or equivalent quarter) hours pursued from SDCCD, in the courses agreed upon by Howard University and San Diego Community College District.
8. This articulation agreement will be in effect initially for a two-year period with an annual review by both parties. Upon completion of the initial two-year period, the agreement will be subject to modifications deemed necessary by the participating parties. All such revisions must be evidenced in writing and signed by the authorized officials of each institution. The general articulation agreement, and those of specific schools and colleges, may be terminated by either party after a one semester notification of intent to terminate the agreement.






