





- Improve Retention, Retention, Retention.
- Rebuild our career education programs (cosmetology, AIRE/HVAC, electronics).
  - Hired two new cosmetology faculty: Charlotte Rankin and Gary Waddy.
- Expand concurrent enrollment by 500 students in the summer.
  - 2,973 students participated in CCAP.
  - 1,093 students participated in concurrent enrollment.

  - Employs about 1 in 30 people in San Diego County.
  - Port jobs: Distribution and Storage Tech, Instructional Designer, IT Project Manager, Business Systems Analysis.
  - Blue Tech partnerships: 1,000 Ocean Startups, Blue Action, National Oceanic and Atmospheric Admin (NOAA), Scripps Institute of Oceanography.


