



Safe App Features



Emergency Options: Quickly connect to the right services during an emergency or to report a safety concern.

Friend Walk: Send your location to a friend, pick a destination, and let your friend track your location in real time.

Report an Incident or Crime Tip: Multiple ways to report a safety/security concern directly to the SDCCD College Police Department.


Campus Maps: Access maps for SDCCD campuses.

Safety Toolbox: Enhance your safety with the set of tools provided in one convenient app.

Chat with College Police: Communicate live with dispatchers at College Police via chat.

I'm OK!: Send your location and a message indicating that "You're OK" to a recipient of your choosing.


Safety Notifications: Receive Timely Warnings, Crime Alerts, and real-time emergency instructions from the SDCCD Police Department during on-campus incidents or critical situations.



Home Screen

- No login or credentials required
- Initial features similar to LiveSafe
- Clicking the banner on any screen returns you to the home page
- Call College Police – Direct dial






Emergency Options

Connects you to 619-388-6405
- Call 988 Crisis Lifeline
Currently connects you to 988 Crisis Lifeline for mental health.
In the future it will connect to **timelycare**
- Emergency Call 911





Friend Walk



Have your walk monitored in real time.

Follow these steps:

1. Select a friend to send your location.
2. Friend has 3 minutes to accept the request.
3. Pick your destination.
4. Start walking!

When you arrive at your destination, simply “Finish Trip”

⚠ Press the "Emergency" button to initiate an emergency call.


May not be seen by a dispatcher in real time.






User must be connected to Wi-Fi or a cellular network to use this feature.



- Can be updated or changed as needed.






"I'm OK"
